We gather not only to grow as musicians, but to remind one another that this work is shared, sustained by community and friendship.

With that spirit in mind, I hope you will join us for two important gatherings in the weeks ahead.

First, please mark your calendar for our **AGO Pittsburgh Christmas Party on Monday, January 26**. It is a simple but meaningful opportunity to reconnect after a busy season, to enjoy one another's company, and to celebrate the relationships that make our chapter strong. I hope that you will join us!

Looking ahead to February, I would especially love to see a strong turnout for our **February 23 Night of Options meeting**, as part of which I will offer a workshop on *Beginning Service Playing*. This session will focus on the musical fundamentals that can quietly but powerfully transform hymn playing: clarity of texture, thoughtful registration, breathing and pacing between stanzas, and shaping hymns as expressive, living music rather than something merely functional. I will also share a number of accessible resources for last-verse harmonizations.

This workshop is intentionally designed to be welcoming and useful to those who are still growing into the role—students, neighboring church musicians, pianists curious about the organ, or anyone who loves the instrument and wants to serve more confidently. Because of that, I encourage each of you to think about who you might personally invite to attend. One thoughtful invitation can make all the difference, and many of us first found our way into the AGO because someone took the time to say, “you should come to this.”

As we begin this new year, I hope it will be one marked by peace, joy, and happy music making. I look forward to seeing you on January 26 and to welcoming new faces on February 23.

## IN MEMORIUM



### J. David Hart, FAGO

*(The following is an edited obituary from his Facebook page)*

After a lengthy illness, J. David Hart of Winter Haven Florida, formerly of Pittsburgh Pennsylvania, died at his home on Tuesday, December 9, 2025 at age 67.

David concertized extensively throughout the United States, Europe, and Australia. For 19 years, he served the Shadyside Presbyterian Church of Pittsburgh. His final position was as organist and choir master of St. Paul's Episcopal Church of Winter Haven, Florida.

He is survived by his 94-year-old mother, Eleanore Hays Hart, his daughter Elizabeth Parker Davis of New Port Richey, and sister Lynne June Perich of Trinity, Florida. He also leaves several nieces and nephews, along with his Aunt June H. Lloyd of the North Hills in Pittsburgh.

A memorial service will be held sometime in January at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Winter Haven.
